Review and Approval of the March 2024 Meeting Minutes with minor corrections Treasurer Report (Jim Wolff)

Review of the Financial Reports shows first quarter 2024 receipts below budget as a result of an extra Sunday Service storm cancelation. Combined with over-budget spending in limited categories losses for the quarter exceeded budget by \$2,270.

With the insurance premium payments completed, we expect receipts to meet operating expenditures for the rest of the year. Special or unexpected expenses will be addressed as they arise.

Finance Committee Report – The second transfer of investment funds to operating cash was completed in March.

Administrative Council Meeting

Board of Trustees Report

Parsonage – three fixes were completed; estimates are being obtained for residing the parsonage (siding is degrading and allowing water infiltration).

Church – evaluation of Memorial Plaques placement is ongoing. Secure space for bell choir equipment has been finalized. Church marque electrical feed may be compromised and will be assessed when ground is dryer.

CMC – Many contacts were made to identify the reason for the delamination of tile in the CMC. The Trustees will obtain the recommended adhesive and test reapplication of loose tiles.

Pastor Jason's Report - Reviewed Program Committees Reports:

Missions – Christmas cards for service members are being prepared. We have in excess of 1000 cards so far. Meals-on-Wheels could use one or two more delivery teams to fill need for fifth day of deliveries. Quilting team has two active participants and could use more volunteers. They make blankets for the hospital for patients to take home.

Staff-Pastor-Parish Relations – working on mid-year pastor evaluations for the Conference.

United Women in Faith – Preparing for the start of quarterly fund-raiser for the Adopt-a-Platoon program. This fund-raiser will provide funds to purchase cards and cover shipping cost to the Adopt-a-Platoon headquarters.

A quote for new siding on the parsonage was obtained. It came back at \$21,000. The trustees are looking for other options.

The window trim needs painting when the weather allows.

# Church

The ceiling in the entry had been damaged by a leak in the roof. The roof has a patch over the hole. After a large rainstorm, that spot is still dry. It will be primed and painted. The cry room windows will not be closed. A new location has been found for the bells. The

donation plaques will be hung in a different place.

Floor Shampooer has not worked in years. It has been discarded.

The key and the door handle for the boiler room sticks. We need to replace the handle.

# CMC

The flooring in the CMC was discussed at length. A letter was received from the manufacturer specifying what kind of glue needs to be used to properly secure the tiles. After careful consideration of all factors, a motion was made and seconded for the church to purchase a 4 gallon bucket of said glue and the trustee members will redo a patch of flooring. If it works, they will re-glue the flooring that needs attention. Jim/Bob

Carbon Monoxide Detectors have been purchased and installed in each room in the church, CMC and parsonage that have a natural gas line.

The marque light is not working. More information needs to be obtained in order to properly and safely repair the problem.

There was discussion on covering the Black Hills Pioneer tiles on the front of the building. The possibility and options will be discussed at next meeting.

## Additional Items

There has been a request that the church purchase and install a motion sensor light at the outside front left corner of the CMC. It was decided to look into the cost of a solar yard light.

The meeting was closed.

Lead Trinity UMC is a small Mainline Protestant church. Our 2024 expense budget is \$3,777 per week with an average attendance of 41 or \$92 per attendee. So far in 2024 our collections are \$3,000 per week or \$73 per attendee. This \$19 revenue shortage per week per person adds up to \$40,500 over the year. If our attendance increased by only 11 people, each giving our current average of \$73 per week, we would break even.

Trinity is one of the rare small churches with an investment reserve and no mortgage. This is a distinct blessing! It provides us flexibility in timing our expenditures, the ability to engage in new outreach, recover from the loss of members, maintain our facilities and to retain quality staff. We should not spend our reserves at the expense of future opportunity. We have survived the COVID years and the impacts from the split of the United Methodist Church. Now is the time to grow back into the thriving community we were prior to COVID.

We are open hearts, open minds, open doors. Please spread the word: Trinity UMC is a vibrant community with a dynamic pastor, active in mission and joyfully singing His praise.
